

Verb: an action word.

Noun: person, place, or thing

Subject Noun: the noun that is doing the action

Indirect Object Noun: The noun that receives the action of the verb through another noun.

Direct Object Noun: The noun that receives the action.

S V DO TO

Jorge envió una carta a Katie.

S V DO TO

George sent Katie a letter.

Pronoun: "Code names" that replace the names of people, places, or things.


Direct Object Pronouns:

He sent it to me.



How can I remember the order?



* Venus was a women. Stereotypically: women = indirect
 Mercury was a man. Stereotypically: men = direct

Venus = IO Mercury = DO

* order of planets from Earth to the sun

Only works for sentences with one verb.

* Earth and sun are most important
 (must have Subject/verb for sentence)

* Earth rotates around the sun
 just like a subject can move around
 its verb.
